# How does ChatGPT work?

We asked ChatGPT3 this question. Here is its output:

“AI text generators typically use a technique called neural language generation, which involves training a neural network on a dataset of text. The network learns patterns in the text and can then generate new text that is similar to the training data. This is often done using a type of neural network called a recurrent neural network (RNN), which is able to process sequences of input (such as a sentence or a paragraph) and generate a corresponding sequence of output (such as a response or a new sentence). The specific details of how a text generator works can vary depending on the architecture and training data used.”



# WHAT ARE THE CHALLENGES OF CHATGPT?

## ChatGPT



### Examples

"Explain quantum computing in simple terms"

"Got any creative ideas for a 10 year old's birthday?"

"How do I make an HTTP request in Javascript?"



### Capabilities

Remembers what user said earlier in the conversation

Allows user to provide follow-up corrections

Trained to decline inappropriate requests



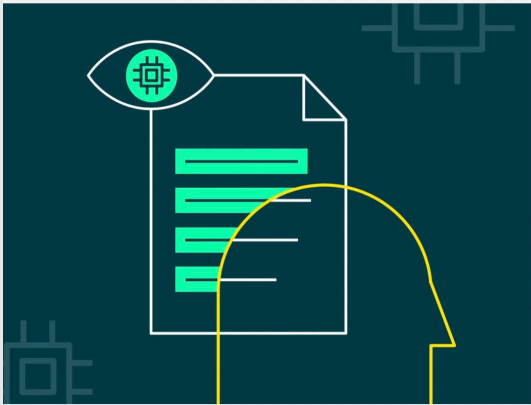
### Limitations

May occasionally generate incorrect information

May occasionally produce harmful instructions or biased content

Limited knowledge of world and events after 2021
