A method where teachers think about their teaching techniques, write about them, and/or discuss them with peers.

A meta-cognitive strategy that helps teachers to think critically about their experiences, actions and decisions during their teaching practices.

does not mean criticising your own teaching, It is also about recognising what is going well and thinking about why it is going well.

It is the ability to reflect on one's actions and engage in the process of analysing and evaluating one's own teaching for continuous learning.


challenging because it requires overcoming the tendency to accept ideas at face value and involves enduring mental discomfort.



- Keep one updated with educational best practices


# Connecting reflection to action


 Reflective practice is only effective if it leads to tangible changes and improvements in teaching.



- helps as a self-assessment tool
- camera captures unaware behaviour and actions
